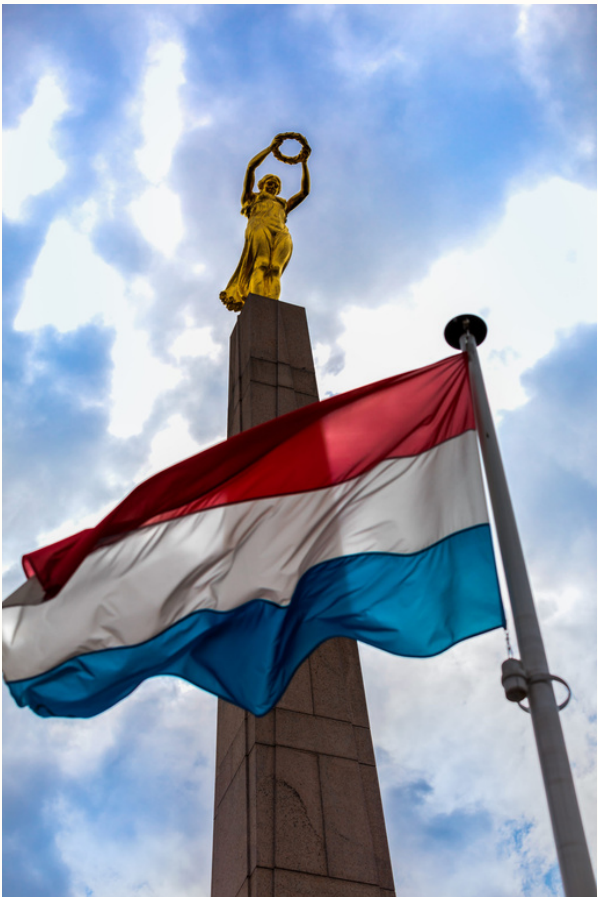

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Welcome to the Conference

The Conference on Sociotechnical Cybersecurity and Privacy (SCP) brings together researchers and practitioners from fields such as computer science, engineering, psychology, social sciences, and economics to explore the relationship between people, technology, security, and privacy.

Created from the merger of the EuroUSEC and STAST communities, SCP focuses on human-centered approaches to cybersecurity and privacy. The conference highlights the idea that effective security depends not only on technical solutions but also on understanding human behavior, system design, and organizational practices. SCP provides a platform to discuss innovative research and practical solutions for building secure, usable, and trustworthy digital systems.

The Venue

Located in Belval, in the south of Luxembourg, the **University of Luxembourg Campus Belval** is a vibrant academic and cultural hub built on a former industrial site. Combining contemporary architecture with renovated heritage buildings, the campus offers an inspiring setting for academic exchange and interdisciplinary dialogue.

Easily accessible by public transport, Belval is directly connected to Luxembourg City by train and bus. The Belval–Université train station is just a few minutes' walk from the conference venue, providing convenient access from the city centre and Luxembourg International Airport.



By plane: Luxembourg Airport (LUX) is the nearest international airport. Tram T1 connects the airport directly to Luxembourg City centre and then to Belval-Université station (total $\approx$ 45 min).

By train / tram: Belval-Université station is within walking distance of the venue. Direct connections from Luxembourg City take approximately 20 minutes. Trains run frequently throughout the day.

By car: The Belval campus is accessible from motorway A4 (exit Esch-sur-Alzette). Paid parking is available on the campus.

Practical tips



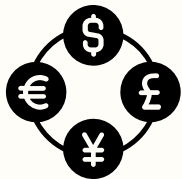
In September, Luxembourg usually enjoys mild and comfortable weather, with temperatures ranging from 12°C to 20°C (54°F to 68°F). Days are often pleasant, though mornings and evenings can be cooler. As occasional rain showers are possible, we recommend bringing layers, a light jacket, and an umbrella to stay comfortable throughout your visit. 🍂☔



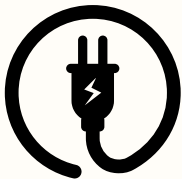

Luxembourg is in the Central European Time (CET) zone, which is offset GMT+1.



Currency in Luxembourg is the Euro.



Luxembourg uses plug types C and F. Type C has two round pins, while type F has two round pins with two earth clips on the sides. The standard voltage is 230V with a frequency of 50Hz.
